Welcome back to the second half of the Spring term. I hope you all managed to have a lovely half term and a well deserved rest.

Last half term had been a difficult one of increased numbers of Covid cases in school which also led to staff absence. We have again received further guidance today regarding self isolation.

From Thursday 24 February, the Government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.

In school we will continue to ask any children who test positive to isolate for at least 5 full days until they have received 2 negative test results on two consecutive days, 24 hours apart.

Thank you for continuing to support us with isolation rule changes.



We are so lucky to have been able to take our key stage 2 children on a residential this year. It was so wonderful to see the children out all together again and being able to develop their character skills of independence, resilience, taking risks and challenging themselves to try new activities. A huge thank you goes to the staff for giving up their time and making the residential pos-

sible for our children. I think the staff and children have all just about caught up on their sleep.














World Book Day will be taking place next week on Thursday 3rd March 2022. The children are of course invited to come to school wearing a costume of their favourite character from their favourite book.
