'Pupils who bring lunch from home are not able to use the same facilities as pupils who eat a schoolprovided lunch. Leaders should ensure that these pupils can eat at tables to have the same opportunities as those who have school lunches.'

Leaders at the school agreed with OFSTED as since my arrival at the school both Mrs Conway and I have been asking the School Food Support Service for more tables for our children to sit on. It has taken 12 months, several phone calls and the OFSTED report for the tables to finally arrive. On Friday they were delivered so that now all of our children can finally sit at a table and enjoy lunch together.
