Unauthorised Absence

For unauthorised leave of absence from August 2024, Penalty Notices will increase to £160 per parent per child (discounted to £80 if paid within 21 days). If there is occasion to issue a second Penalty Notice for unauthorised leave of absence within a rolling 3 year period, it will be issued at the higher rate of £160 per parent per child, with no opportunity to pay at the lower level. A Penalty Notice cannot be issued if there is a third occasion of unauthorised leave of absence in the rolling 3 year period and it is highly likely that the Local Authority will take direct prosecution action in the Magistrates Court. Currently, if your child has unauthorised leave of absence of 5 days or more prior to the end of the summer term in 2024, it is likely you will be issued with a Penalty Notice of £120 per parent per child (discounted to £60 if paid within 21 days).
