All children were taught PSHE for one session per week. We continued this through lockdown through the Google Classroom. Feedback from parents through remote learning was positive and they said this had impacted positively on their children's mental health through lockdown.
Children make accelerated progress in reading to make expected attainment.	£3000	All key stage two pupils to have guided reading lessons using Pearson's guided resources.	All key stage 2 pupils were taught using Pearson's guided resources. These were also sent home during lockdown so that the children could continue to be assigned these

			at home to work on. 3 out of the 4 pupils continued with these at home. 3 out of 4 pupils continued to make good progress and attainment despite the lockdown.
Improved attendance	£150	Attendance officer monitoring attendance.	The attendance offer was working effectively with the parent to ensure the 3 children arrived on time for school. We were then unable to track attendance due to the school closure due to lockdown. When school reopens in August we will begin to monitor the attendance again with our attendance officer.
