

Coastline

This project teaches children about the physical and human features of coastal regions across the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the coastal town of Whitby, in Yorkshire.

English

Phonics

We will continue using our Little Wandle Phonics Scheme to 'Grow the Code' and continue to learn new Phase 5 graphemes.

Reading

We will continue our Little Wandle reading groups as well as having whole class reading sessions focusing on our Reading VIPERS.

Writing

We will start the year by looking at the book 'Dear Earth'. We will be writing instructions, poems, speeches and letters!

Maths

Year 1

We continue to look at addition and subtraction within 20 and then numbers to 50!

Year 2

First we will dive into money and then move onto multiplication and division,

Science

First Mr Lawson will consolidate our learning about habitats and what a habitat needs to provide. Then we will learn about the use of materials. This will teach us about the uses of everyday materials and how materials' properties make them suitable or unsuitable for specific purposes. We will then begin to explore how materials can be changed.

Music

With Mrs Stevenson we will be working on rhythm and pitch.

PSHE

We will focus on 'Diversity and Communities'.

Computing

To begin we focus on digital photography, including exploring taking photographs in both portrait and landscape formats and explore lighting and effects. Then we will look at pictograms.

Art and Design

We will learn about the visual elements of flowers, including shape, texture, colour, pattern and form. We will also explore various artistic methods, including drawing, printmaking and 3-D forms, using paper and clay.

Design and Technology

We will learn about making and strengthening structures, including different ways of joining materials.

PE

Mr Slaney will be focusing on gymnastics and dance.

RE

We will first revisit and continue to deepen our understanding of 'Who is a Muslim and how do they live?' Then we answer the question 'Why does Easter matter to Christians?'

History/Geography

We will use maps to learn about the location of the world's seas and oceans and keys to learn about map symbols. We will also find out about the directions on a compass and learn about the human and physical features of a coastline, including the effects of erosion and how to stay safe when visiting the coast. We will have the opportunity to learn about the work of the RNLI, what happened to the SS Rohilla and about the coastal town of Whitby, including how Captain Cook is linked to the town. Finally we will research the tourism industry and consider what features make a place a successful tourist destination.
