

School Days



This project teaches children about their own school and locality, both today and in the past. They compare schooling in the Victorian era to their experiences today.

English

Phonics

We will continue to grow the code and learn new Phase 5 sounds, using our Little Wandle Phonics Scheme.

Reading

We will continue our Little Wandle reading groups as well as having whole class reading sessions focusing on our Reading VIPERS.

Writing

We will begin our new writing unit by focusing on setting descriptions and then explanation texts.

RE

We will look and answer the big question 'who do Christians say made the world?'.

Maths

Year I

We will focus on multiplication and division and then move onto fractions

Year 2

We will focus on fractions, problem solving and time.

PE

Mr Slaney will be focusing on dance and mini athletics.

Science

In science with Mr Lawson we will learn about animal parts where we will focus on identify and describing their common structures, diets, and how animals should be cared for and plant parts where we think about the basic parts of plants and observe how they change over time.

Computing

We will finish our grouping data project and then move onto digital writing and programming animations.

Music

With Mrs Stevenson we will be working on 'Music Technology'.

History/Geography

We will learn about the differences between schooling in the Victorian era and schooling today. We will learn about objects found in a Victorian classroom and how they were used. We will also research Samuel Wilderspin, an important figure in the development of schooling for young children in the Victorian era, whose ideals are reflected in schooling today.

PSHE

We will focus on 'relationships', 'managing safety and risks' and 'healthy lifestyles'.

Art and Design

We will start our 'Street View' project artwork depicting streets and buildings. We will focus on the work of the American popartist, James Rizzi and create a 3D mural based on Rizzi's work.

Design and Technology

We will start our project 'Chop, Slice and Mash.' This project teaches children about sources of food and the preparatory skills of peeling, tearing, slicing, chopping, mashing and grating.
