Our aim is to provide a high quality, engaging and creative art and design curriculum, to inspire our children to develop skills and techniques which enables them to embellish, explore and express using different materials.

- The art curriculum will develop children's critical abilities so that they can reflect and improve with a 'Thinking for Myself' mindset.
- The children will have an understanding of their own as well as others' cultural heritage. They will study a diverse range of artists through the ages linked to the main learning projects.
- The children will learn and understand the visual elements of art and design including line, tone, texture, colour, pattern, shape, 3D form, which will be developed by providing a curriculum which will enable children to reach their full potential and 'Fly High'.
- The children will be able to use a range of media proficiently and with confidence.

We teach the National Curriculum, supported by a clear skills and knowledge progression using a variety of termly projects. This ensures that skills and knowledge are built on year after year.

- Children will develop their understanding of the visual language of art with effective teaching and sequenced lessons and experiences so they can grow as an artist.
- The skills and knowledge that children will develop throughout each art project are mapped across a two year rolling program and are progressive throughout the school.
- The emphasis on vocabulary and knowledge ensures that children understand the context of the artwork, and the artists through discussion through 'More Than Just Me'.
- Children are given opportunities to express their creative imagination by practising and developing mastery in the key processes of art including drawing, painting, printing, textiles and sculpture.
- Creativity is explored through the school's outdoor area, with planned opportunities for learning outside the classroom.
- Each year the children complete the same three sketches in their portfolios to show progression, skills and knowledge.
